- Never let the power cable come into contact with other cables. Handle the power cable and all mains voltage connections with particular caution!
- Never remove warning or informative labels from the unit.
- Do not open the equipment and do not modify the unit.
- · Do not connect this equipment to a dimmer pack.
- Do not switch the equipment on and off in short intervals, as this will reduce the system's life.
- Only use the equipment indoors.
- Do not expose to flammable sources, liquids or gases.
- Always disconnect the power from the mains when equipment is not in use or before cleaning! Only handle the power-cable by the plug. Never pull out the plug by pulling the power-cable.





DMX mode:

To access the DMX mode, press the "**MODE**" button on the rear of the unit to show Addr on the LED display. Now press the "**ENTER**" button and use the "**UP**" and "**DOWN**" buttons to set the desired DMX address from ADD I - AS I2. Press the "**ENTER**" button to confirm the setting.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

Auto mode:

To access the auto mode, press the "**MENU**" button on the front of the unit to show AUE_{\Box} on the LED display. Now press the "**ENTER**" button and use the "**UP**" and "**DOWN**" buttons to choose one of the 19 built-in programs. Press the "**ENTER**" button to confirm the setting. Use the "**UP**" and "**DOWN**" buttons to adjust the speed between 5000 - 5255 (000 - slow, 255 - fast).

Press the enter button to confirm the setting then use the "**UP**" and "**DOWN**" buttons to adjust the strobe speed between $F \downarrow \square \square - F \downarrow \square \square \square$ (FL00 - strobe off, FL04 - strobe fast press the enter button to confirm the setting.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

Sound active mode:

To access the sound active mode, press the "**MENU**" button on the front of the unit to show $5 \mu \mu n$ on the LED display. Now press the "**ENTER**" button to display $5 d \Box \Box - 5 d I \Box$, then use the "**UP**" and "**DOWN**" buttons to select the desired light show. To exit out of any of the above options, press the "**MENU**" button. (The Sound LED will flash to indicate when the unit detects sound).

Master/slave mode:

To set the master unit, press the "**MENU**" button on the rear of the master unit to select your desired program (sound active or auto).

To set the other units in slave mode, press the "**MENU**" button on the rear of the unit to show **ADD** I on the LED display and press the "**ENTER**" button to confirm the setting. The units will now run in sequence with the master unit. Link the fixtures with DMX cables starting at the master and connecting to each of the slave unit (maximum 16 units).

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

Setting the DMX address:

The DMX mode enables the use of a universal DMX controller. Each fixture requires a "start address" from 1- 512. A fixture requiring one or more channels for control begins to read the data on the channel indicated by the start address. For example, a fixture that occupies or uses 7 channels of DMX and was addressed to start on DMX channel 100, would read data from channels: 100,101,102,103,104,105 and 106. Choose a start address so that the channels used do not overlap. E.g. the next unit in the chain starts at 107.

DMX 512:

DMX (Digital Multiplex) is a universal protocol used as a form of communication between intelligent fixtures and controllers. A DMX controller sends DMX data instructions form the controller to the fixture. DMX data is sent as serial data that travels from fixture to fixture via the DATA "IN" and DATA "OUT" XLR terminals located on all DMX fixtures (most controllers only have a data "out" terminal).

DMX linking:

DMX is a language allowing all makes and models of different manufactures to be linked together and operate from a single controller, as long as all fixtures and the controller are DMX compliant. To ensure proper DMX data transmission, when using several DMX fixtures try to use the shortest cable path possible. The order in which fixtures are connected in a DMX line does not influence the DMX addressing. For example; a fixture assigned to a DMX address of 1 may be placed anywhere in a DMX line, at the beginning, at the end, or anywhere in the middle. When a fixture is assigned a DMX address of 1, the DMX controller knows to send DATA assigned to address 1 to that unit, no matter where it is located in the DMX chain.

DATA cable (DMX cable) requirements (for DMX operation):

This fixture can be controlled via DMX-512 protocol. The DMX address is set on the back of the unit. Your unit and your DMX controller require a standard 3-pin XLR connector for data input/output, see image below.




Further DMX cables can be purchased from all good sound and lighting suppliers or Pro Light Concepts dealers. Please quote: CABL10 – 2m CABL11 – 5m

Also remember that DMX cable must be daisy chained and cannot be split.

Notice:

Be sure to follow the diagrams below when making your own cables. Do not connect the cables shield conductor to the ground lug or allow the shield conductor to come in contact with the XLRs outer casing. Grounding the shield could cause a short circuit and erratic behaviour.




Special note:

Line termination:

When longer runs of cable are used, you may need to use a terminator on the last unit to avoid erratic behaviour. Using a cable terminator will decrease

the possibilities of erratic behaviour.




Termination reduces signal transmission problems and interferance. it is always advisable to connect a DMX terminal, (resistance 120 Ohm 1/4 W) between pin 2 (DMX-) and pin 3 (DMX+) of the last fixture.

(3-pin - Order ref: CABL90, 5-pin - Order ref: CABL89)

5-pin XLR DMX connectors:

Some manufactures use 5-pin XLR connectors for data transmission in place of 3-pin. 5-pin XLR fixtures may be implemented in a 3-pin XLR DMX line. When inserting standard 5-pin XLR connectors in to a 3-pin line a cable adaptor must be used. The diagram below details the correct cable conversion.
