Quick Start Guide

Can't wait to get going? Here's your quick start guide...

First assemble your instrument by gently placing the mouthpiece into the leadpipe





Holding your pBugle:

It is important you are feeling relaxed whilst playing the pBugle, there is no right or wrong way for you to hold it. Hold the instrument in whichever way feels comfortable for you. We simply recommend you hold it with your thumb or thumbs facing your face.





Here are three ways of holding pBugle you may like to try.

- 1: Left hand only
- 2: Both hands
- 3: Right hand only

How to Play

Breathing is the heart and soul of trumpet playing.

Take a relaxed deep breath and blow out through your lips.



Hold just the mouthpiece to the middle of your lips, making a firm seal (like the pictures above).

Take a big, relaxed breath, create a hole in your lips and blow air through the mouthpiece. You may get a buzz straight away!

If the buzz doesn't happen straight away, as you blow, slowly make the hole smaller by making your lips firmer. The buzz will begin.

Now insert the mouthpiece into your pBugle and repeat the process, remember to breathe lots of air in and blow lots of air out!

Care and advice

General

Cleaning: We recommend that you clean the instrument before first use. pBugle is completely made from ABS recyclable plastic, making it very durable and robust. It also includes antimicrobial technology – an agent that kills microorganisms and inhibits their growth. To clean the external surfaces, use a soft cloth with warm soapy water and dry the instrument with a lint free cloth.

Tuning slide



It would be good to regularly make sure your tuning slide is greased with a regular slide grease or petroleum jelly. We recommend that the tuning slide be placed about 10mm out and then adjusted for performance preference.



Damage or repairs

Any minor damage may be mended with superglue. If you aren't sure, then please just contact one of our pPals at info@pbone.co.uk.
